It was Mr Baria's turn to deliver assemblies to all year groups which centred on the idea that knowledge gives us power. After school on Tuesday, I met with the new head students (King and Summer) and their predecessors (Joe and Hannah) along with Mrs George to talk about the future of student leadership. King and Hannah have a key role to play in representing the views of the lower school as well as shaping the school experience for all and I am very much looking forward to hearing their ideas. They will also be coming to senior leadership meetings once a half term to give feedback on their work and the views of the students.

You will hopefully have all seen the press release for the Astro-Turf in the local news which is great for the community. The work on the pitch is progressing well and I am looking forward to sharing pictures when all the work is complete. It is going to be a wonderful surface that our children will benefit from during school hours with the wider community benefiting from it outside of school hours.
