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Dear Parent/Carer,

The penultimate week of the term has been a chilly one but the cold weather did nothing to dampen our spirits around the academy. There is lots to share with you but I wanted to start by thanking those of you that have taken the time to complete the parent/carer survey for us. In total there have been 270 responses so far and when the survey closes, I will share the outcomes with you and explain the next steps for gathering specific feedback on the areas for improvement.

Our second ever WOW day took place last Friday and it was heart-warming to see the children all smiling and enjoying the day. The day started with music playing out down the driveway with the children all choosing a golden ticket from the box and hoping to be one of the lucky winners. The music continued at break and lunchtimes with further opportunities to draw tickets from boxes before the prize winners were drawn at the end of the day. All students were then given a chocolate bar on the way out as we wished them all a happy weekend.

Mr Haig led assemblies for all year groups this week which centred on Pledge 3 'We are a telling school, so we are never a bystander' and explained our anti-bullying agenda. He explored the difference between one-off incidents and the characteristics of bullying such as it being repetitive and sustained as well as often involving an imbalance of power. Students were reminded of the different ways they can report any concerns including the SHARP system which is anonymous and can be accessed directly through the school website. Leading on from the assembly, Mrs George also presented our new anti-bullying ambassadors with their gold ties which they have all been wearing with pride.

On the theme of student pledges, it fills me with pride to see so many of our children keen to tell me the pledges that they have learned by heart. There are an increasing number of children that can list all 5 pledges in order and have been earning lots of golden tickets as a result.

On Wednesday, a number of our Year 11 students went to the Corn Exchange to watch a performance of Macbeth which is one of the two texts they are studying for their GCSE literature exam. It was a great opportunity for them to see the play live and help consolidate their understanding of the plot and key themes. Following on with the theme of Year 11 trips linked to their GCSE examinations, our Year 11 geographers went to the Rushden Lakes complex to complete some important fieldwork and hone their skills ahead of the exams in the Summer.

On Friday morning, I was visiting lessons and went into a Year 10 food lesson where the students were all learning how to pare a whole chicken into its various parts such as the winglets, wings and legs. I was very impressed with the knife skills and the students all seemed to be thoroughly enjoying it, so if your son or daughter was in this lesson you can definitely make use of their newfound skills at home!
