Week 5 of the academic term has been a busy one with open evenings, SEND drop-in sessions and football tournaments!

Mr Haig led assemblies this week which focused on Black History Month for which this year's theme is reclaiming narratives. He shared some powerful historical images of times where prejudicial treatment towards ethnic minorities was commonplace. Mr Haig then talked about the fundamental British value of tolerance and the importance of this value within our school community.
